PRIMARY SCHOOL END-OF-YEAR EXAMINATIONS / ASSESSMENTS RULES (FROM MONDAY 10 NOVEMBER – TUESDAY 25 NOVEMBER 2025)

Attached, please find the end-of-year examinations timetable for Grades 4 - 7 for your information.

Please take note of the following:-

- Afternoon activities and extra lessons will end on Thursday 6 November 2025.
- Full and neat uniform is to be worn every day, and excellent behaviour must continue until the last day of school.
- Punctuality is essential. No extra time will be given in the event of latecoming.
- Absence from an examination will result in no marks given. ONLY a doctor's certificate indicating a <u>SERIOUS</u> ailment will be accepted for absenteeism.
- Subject textbooks must be handed in on the last day that a specific subject is written.
- Outstanding library books must be returned.
- End of year documentation will not be released unless textbooks have been returned or paid for.
- There must be no talking during exam and study sessions.
- School diaries must be at school every day.
- Cornerstone College's procedures regarding cell-phones and electronic devices hold during the
 examination period. The mere presence of cell-phones or devices in the examination venues will result
 in an examination irregularity disciplinary enquiry being called. No smart watches may be worn in the
 study or exam venue.
- Students will not be allowed to borrow or lend any stationery so kindly ensure that each student comes
 to school with all the stationery that will be needed.
- Examination / assessment irregularities or cheating will result in no marks being awarded, and an exclusion-level disciplinary enquiry called.
- Our fees policy remains in effect until the end of the year. Please do not disrupt your child's education by late payment of fees.

HIGH SCHOOL END-OF-YEAR EXAMINATIONS RULES: Thursday 6 November 2025 – Friday 28 November 2025

Attached, please find the end-of-year examination timetable for your information.

- The Term 4 extra-murals end on Friday 31 October, to allow students extra time to study for the end-of-year examinations.
- Full and neat uniform is to be worn every day, and excellent behaviour continues to the last day of school.
- Punctuality is essential. No extra time will be given in the event of late-coming.
- <u>Every</u> student attends school <u>every day</u>. Absence from a study session will result in strict penalties.
- Absence from an examination will result in no marks given. ONLY a doctor's certificate indicating a <u>SERIOUS</u> ailment will be acceptable, and only after we have investigated its validity telephonically with the doctor. If a student misses a study session without excuse, formal detentions will be issued.
- School closes at 1:45pm during the examination period. Day scholars must go home immediately after school is released.
- School diaries must be at school every day. If the diary is not at school, the student will be required to stay at school until 1:45pm the following day.
- Earlier school closing times will be communicated in the school diary on the previous day.
- Diaries must be signed by the parent/guardian each day. Should a student fail to write in the closing times for the next day, or should the diary not be signed, the student will be required to stay at school until 1:45pm on the day. Diaries may not be signed in advance.
- Students are not permitted to loiter around Silverton when they are released from school. Study facilities are available in the Hall after school. Students who are waiting for transport or for siblings from Primary School to be released, must wait in the Hall immediately after school is released.
- Active, written, supervised study will be undertaken when a student is not actually writing an examination.
- Study sessions will be conducted in silence. Any misbehaviour will result in the learner being removed from the venue, and being penalised.
- Cheating will result in no marks being awarded, and an exclusion-level disciplinary enquiry called. Students be warned!
- Subject textbooks must be handed in on the last day that a specific subject is written.
- Outstanding library books must be returned.
- End of year documentation will not be released unless all textbooks have been returned or paid for.
- Our fees policy remains in effect during the end-of-year examination period. Please do not disrupt your child's education by late payment of fees.
- A good night's sleep, healthy food, exercise, good lighting and fresh air while studying are essential during this
 time. Screen time for leisure should be strictly limited.
- Students will not be allowed to borrow or lend any stationery or equipment during the examinations. No Tippex is allowed.
- Cornerstone College's procedures regarding cell-phones and electronic devices hold during the examination period. The mere presence of cell-phones in an exam or study venue will result in an examination irregularity disciplinary enquiry being called. No smart watches may be worn in the study or exam venue.
